The State Agency on Intellectual Property (AGEPI) invites interested parties to participate in a workshop on intellectual property, organized by the School of Advanced Studies in Nova Gorica, Slovenia, within the project Fostering Innovation in the Danube Region through Knowledge Engineering and IPR Management (KnowING IPR).

During the Workshop will be addressed intellectual property policy in the project member countries as well as identified possible recommendations for improving the legal framework and policy in the field in the context of the challenges facing the states of the Danube Region at this stage.
